Chapter 12 – Judges

P 117 B. Exhibiting Requirements for each Refresher

B. 1. Insert or part of a year: Earn at least two (2) exhibiting credits for each year or part of a year between each refresher, including at least one (1) ribbon in Horticulture and one (1) ribbon in Design in an NGC Flower Show.

P 118 E. ~~Strike E. No more than one (1) refresher for credit is permitted per calendar year.~~

Replace: E. Refreshers may be taken every four (4) months if all requirements to refresh are met.

P 119 Chart Accredited Judge to Life Judge Requirements

4. ~~Strike one (1) year and~~ replace with four (4) months.

P 119, VI. Becoming an Accredited Master Judge

Under Judging Requirements per Refresher, strike B. 2. and insert

2. A Horticulture Specialty Flower Show requires one (1) class in Horticulture and five (5) classes in any of the four (4) Divisions (Horticulture, Education, Youth/Sponsored Groups or Botanical Arts). A Design Specialty Flower Show requires three (3) classes of Design or two (2) classes of Design and one (1) class in any of the Divisions (Design, Education, Youth/Sponsored Groups or Botanical Arts).
