BEFORE you start writing the schedule, there are lots of questions for you to consider...






Is this your first flower show ever?

SPACE will limit your size and scope!








When considering the venue, you also need to consider the lighting, space for design & horticulture prep,

Once you've considered all the elements of your show, you are FINALLY ready to begin writing your flower show schedule.




Did you know that National Garden Clubs has a sample Flower Show Schedule on the website for you to view, reference and use to write your flower show schedule?
