No individual, single member club, group of member clubs, Council, or Districts may make direct application to National Garden Clubs. All applications must come through your State Chairman and must include the appropriate NGC Application Cover Sheet. All Application Cover Sheets are posted in fillable format on the NGC website under FORMS.

Introduction

The 2023-2025 NGC Awards Committee is pleased to bring this updated Awards Handbook to our membership. You will find just a few changes from the program presented during the last term. Response to that revised program was very positive and we are encouraged that members are more comfortable in applying for those well-deserved awards!

One of the changes to note for this term is that ALL applications will be sent electronically. Yes, even the Flower Show Books of Evidence! Working with the theme for this term of GO GREEN—PLANT AMERICA, our goal is to help our members achieve this ideal by submitting electronic entries rather than using up more of our natural resources. With all entries coming in electronic format, our judges will find a more equitable judging platform. The NGC website has a video on how to prepare and submit an electronic entry for those who are a bit uncomfortable with this process.

An important piece to remember when preparing your application is to refer to the criteria of the scoring rubric for your award. This will guide you in knowing what information to include in your entry and where to place the emphasis as you write. As before, most awards use the general scoring rubric, but be careful to refer to the correct rubric if you are entering in an area that has a specific rubric.

As you select the photos to include with your entry, please include one high-quality photo of the finished product. We would like to include a number of photos in the slide show highlighting the winning entries. Having high-quality photos to pull from will help us achieve that goal—especially if no people are in those photos! There is information on the NGC website to help you know what constitutes a high-quality photo. Just search for "quality photo" and become educated on this topic!

Our NGC clubs are active, vital parts of their communities, providing beauty and awareness of our natural world in many different ways. We look forward to presenting many awards to recognize the value of your work during the two years of this term!

The Process

Review the **General Directions**. Follow those guidelines.



Use the **Chart of Awards** or online **Table of Awards** to decide which award is best for your entry. This tells you who is eligible to apply for that award and the items required.



Go to the **Award Description** for further details. On the NGC website, click on the name of the award category from the Table of Awards to go directly to that award's descriptive information.



After reviewing the description details, fill out the **Application Cover Sheet**. On the NGC website, click on "Application" in the right column to go directly to the cover sheet for that award. Download the blank Cover Sheet to your computer. Be sure to name it something you will remember and put it in a file where you can find it again! Open the new file and fill out each section of the Cover Sheet, using the tab key to move between sections. When it is complete, be sure to save your changes. MAC users open the form in Preview before completing.



Go back to the Award Description and look carefully at the **Scoring Rubric** to see what the judges will look for as they score your entry. Most awards use the General Scoring Rubric which you can find by clicking on the Scoring in the same box to the right of the award name. If your award has a specific Scoring Rubric, it will also be given immediately following the award description. Use this information to help you understand what you should include in your application.



Write your **Award Application**. Be sure to adhere to the page limit and use a clear, easily read font. Include photos when applicable. Insert the photos as you write to avoid the need for adding captions. If you need help with that, ask the Awards Co-Chairman. Ask someone else to read over the completed application for clarity and editing.



Send the Cover Sheet and Completed Application as indicated in your individual State guidelines by the due date required for your state.

General Information About Awards

The Awards Year is from January 1 through December 31.

Only National Garden Clubs, Inc. members and affiliates are eligible with the exception of applicants for the following:

- Award of Excellence for Non-Members
- High School Distinguished Service Project

All applications must include an NGC Application Cover Sheet and are sent to your State Awards Chairmen who will set due dates for them.

All applications with photos of people, including Youth under age 18, MUST have a signed Publications Release Form for each person involved on file at NGC Headquarters.

See FORMS section on NGC website.

Judges will not open hyperlinks embedded in any application with the exception of Membership Advancement & Education awards 1 (Membership Awareness), 2 (Social Media/Website), and 3 (Digital Presentation).

All applications will be sent electronically. Electronic applications must be in PDF (preferred) or WORD format.

If a project is eligible for various awards, do not submit an exact duplication of the application.

The General Scoring Rubric will be used for scoring unless otherwise indicated in award description.
