Charles Towne Landing State Historic Site (CTL)

We are very pleased to hold LDS at **Founders Hall** located at Charles Towne Landing once again. **Charles Towne Landing State Historic Site** sits on a marshy point, located off of the Ashley River, where a group of English settlers landed in 1670 and established what would become the birthplace of the Carolina colony.

The grounds include 80 acres of gardens, with an elegant live oak allée and the Legare-Waring House. Founders Hall is a state-of-the-art facility and LEED certified building with ample parking on site.

Course 4 is the fourth of four courses in Series 17 of the Landscape Design Study Program. Garden club members, Master Gardeners, home owners, public officials, nurserymen and others are urged to avail themselves of the expert instructions presented by outstanding lecturers engaged for the school. - Course Schedule -

Check-in registration begins Tuesday morning at 8:30 with the program beginning promptly at 9:00. Tuesday morning will be dedicated to presentations followed by lunch. Students may choose from regular, vegetarian or gluten free offerings. After lunch we will travel in private cars to downtown Charleston to tour and evaluate selected gardens. Students are then free to adjourn once they have completed their visits.

Wednesday registration will begin at 8:30 with the program beginning at 9:00. Presentations should be finished at about 1:00 at which time we will adjourn. Students taking the exam will stay for lunch which will be followed by the exam. Typically, the exam will take about 15-20 minutes to complete.

Field Trip to Historic Charleston Public Gardens

We will be visiting the following public gardens in downtown Charleston to observe the impact of community engagement and conduct on-site evaluations of each garden's design. We will introduce and utilize the National Garden Club's Evaluation Guidelines to quantify the various landscape design components that should be considered when evaluating a property. Students will travel via their private cars to the gardens. Street parking is available along with several paid parking lots/garages directly across the street from the gardens.

Restoration of the circa 1800 Joseph Manigault Home Garden

Imagine during difficult financial times having to sell off part of a circa 1800 historic garden for the construction of a gas station.



Learn how community involvement funded, reclaimed and restored this public garden to its original circa 1800 splendor.

Revitalization to Wragg Square Public Garden

This early 19th century park was revitalized over a period of several years via collaboration with neighborhood community groups, local government and interested private individuals.



Renovation of Vangie Rainsford Park

The neighborhood association funded and drove the renovation of this small garden as a gateway to the Charleston Garden District.



Philip Simmons Memorial Garden

Renowned ironworker Philip Simmons and topiary artist Pearl Fryer collaborated on the design and installation of this garden now maintained by volunteers with the Garden Club of Charleston.



- Restaurants and Accommodations -

If you choose to stay in town for a drink or dinner Tuesday night after the garden tours there are several nice restaurants close by the gardens on Hutson Alley and King Street.

For those of you who are wishing to spend the night, there are many hotels in the Historic District, West Ashley, Mt. Pleasant and North Charleston. Charles Towne Landing is conveniently and centrally located to all areas. Also, the Dewberry Hotel, Embassy Suites and Hampton Inn are directly across the street from the gardens to be visited in the Historic District.

- Course Registration -

Student Enrollment will be open until October 30 or when the class reaches capacity, whichever comes first. Due to our limited seating capacity and anticipated high level of demand we recommend that you promptly register if interested.

- NGC Consultant Certification -

The School program is offered as a service to the public, but only members of a club federated with the National Garden Clubs Inc. are eligible to become NGC Landscape Consultants. All members who successfully complete all four courses with exam results at 70% or higher will qualify for the title of National Garden Clubs (NGC) "Landscape Design Consultant."

Out of state students who are members of a NGC affiliated club may also receive certification credit for completing this course and exam. Please request an official record from your State School Chair.

To remain in Good Standing, Consultants may Refresh after one year, but must refresh before five years from the date of achieving Consultant status. They must attend all lectures, but do not need to take the examination. After a Consultant's fourth refresher they achieve Master Consultant status.

Nonmembers may complete the courses and the exam, join an NGC garden club within a year from the last course, and become an NGC "Landscape Design Consultant."

All Garden Club of South Carolina Landscape Design Consultants also automatically become a member of the GCSC Consultants Council.

Students Refreshing or Auditing (Tuition and 1 lunch): \$110

Lunch is included for all participants on Tuesday and those taking the exam on Wednesday.

Extra lunches can be ordered for \$25 each.
