Most state deadlines are in late fall, so work on the application before the busy holiday season begins!

This handbook has been prepared to provide you with the resources needed to prepare an award-winning application. Think about your work. Look at the list in this handbook of the awards and determine which category is most appropriate. Choose the specific award. Read the description for that award. Read through the rubric, whether it be the general rubric or a specific one for that award. Write your story. Add some photos. Names are not necessary in the story – they actually detract from the story--and photos are best featuring the work done, not the people involved.

Awards serve several purposes. Awards create pride through recognition. They encourage members to do more. Awards bring awareness of a club as an asset to the community and inspire others to pursue worthwhile projects. An active, award-winning club attracts new members.

Garden club projects are vital parts of our communities. The future of garden clubs is secured by the visible work that we do. Let's remember to showcase that work through applying for awards in recognition of the significance of our work.

The Process

Review the **General Directions**. Follow those guidelines.



Use the **Chart of Awards** or online **Table of Awards** to decide which award is best for your entry. This tells you who is eligible to apply for that award and the items required.



Go to the **Award Description** for further details. On the NGC website, click on the name of the award category from the Table of Awards to go directly to that award's descriptive information.



After reviewing the description details, fill out the **Application Cover Sheet**. On the NGC website, click on "Application" in the right column to go directly to the cover sheet for that award. Download the blank Cover Sheet to your computer. Be sure to name it something you will remember and put it in a file where you can find it again! Open the new file and fill out each section of the Cover Sheet, using the tab key to move between sections. When it is complete, be sure to save your changes. MAC users open the form in Preview before completing.



Go back to the Award Description and look carefully at the **Scoring Rubric** to see what the judges will look for as they score your entry. Most awards use the General Scoring Rubric which you can find by clicking on the Scoring in the same box to the right of the award name. If your award has a specific Scoring Rubric, it will also be given immediately following the award description. Use this information to help you understand what you should include in your application.



Write your **Award Application**. Be sure to adhere to the page limit and use a clear, easily read font. Include photos when applicable. Insert the photos as you write to avoid the need for adding captions. If you need help with that, ask the Awards Co-Chairman. Ask someone else to read over the completed application for clarity and editing.



Send the Cover Sheet and Completed Application as indicated in your individual State guidelines by the due date required for your state.

***All forms in this handbook are posted on the NGC website in the FORMS section as fillable forms. Scoring Rubrics are also available on the AWARDS page of the website under the State and Regional Awards Chairmen tab.**

General Information About Awards

The Awards Year is from January 1 through December 31.

Only National Garden Clubs, Inc. members and affiliates are eligible with the exception of applicants for the following:

- Award of Excellence for Non-Members
- High School Distinguished Service Project

Please remember:

No individual, single member club, group of member clubs, Council, or Districts may make direct application to National Garden Clubs. **All applications must be submitted by your State Chairman and must include the appropriate NGC Application Cover Sheet.** Application Cover Sheets are posted in fillable format on the NGC website under FORMS.

All applications with photos of people, including Youth under age 18, MUST have a signed Publications Release Form for each person involved on file at NGC Headquarters. It is the responsibility of the applicant to see that these are sent in a timely manner. It is recommended that photographs NOT include people. See NGC Photo Release on Forms page.

Judges will not open hyperlinks embedded in any application with the exception of Membership Advancement & Education awards 1 (Membership Awareness), 2 (Website), and 3 (Digital Presentation).

Electronic applications must be in PDF (preferred) or WORD format. Digital photos for FD-1 should be in .jpg, .png or other commonly accepted format for photos.

If a project is eligible for various awards, do not submit an exact duplication of the application.

The General Scoring Rubric will be used for scoring unless otherwise indicated in the award description.

The following Certificates will be awarded:

- Certificate of Merit - overall winner
- Certificate of Commendation - runners up
- Certificate of Appreciation - other award submissions received by NGC

This award will not be given to the same project in two consecutive years.

These projects may be awarded more than once, but not in consecutive years. Projects may be sited on rural byways, urban highways, roadside rest areas, entrances to towns, medians, etc.
